## Our Transition to an Integrated Care System

The timeline for establishing ICSs has been extended to allow sufficient time for the Bill to pass through Parliament. The Integrated Care Board, which takes on the statutory responsibilities of the CCG, will now become a legal organisation on 1 July 2022.

As we move towards a period of transition and change, we continue to work closely with our staff to ensure they are informed and supported.

Across BLMK, health and care organisations have been working collaboratively as a system partnership since 2019. This has enabled us to lay strong foundations for working in partnership across BLMK; and the formal creation of the Integrated Care System in July strengthens our approach to support and improve health and wellbeing in our communities.

I am pleased to share that the new name for our partnership is Bedfordshire, Luton and Milton Keynes Health and Care Partnership. You will start to see our new branding on ICS materials and communications. We are also developing a new website which will go live in the coming weeks.







## How technology is assisting our system provide better and joined up care

A new Shared Health and Care Record is being rolled out across BLMK. Completely confidential and secure, it is designed to help doctors, nurses and other health and social care professionals directly involved in a patient's care make better, safer and quicker decisions.

It will be accessed via a link from each organisation's clinical system, providing health and care staff with instant access to important information about a patient.
