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Support for children in Luton living with epilepsy

A new and advanced secure online platform called *Patients Know Best* allows parents to log their child's seizures and details like when and where they happen, how long they last, type of seizure and any possible triggers.

The information is accessed by the local NHS epilepsy team to ensure they get the right advice and care.

Aiming for improved lung health with targeted checks

Residents in Central Bedfordshire will benefit from better lung healthcare by accepting an invitation to the Targeted Lung Health Checks programme. Statistically the county has poor outcomes for lung cancer, with significant numbers of the population either being smokers or ex-smokers.

However, with the programme in full operation potentially hundreds of people could receive potentially life-saving treatments.

ELFT has partnered with the Institute of Health Equity with the aim to become the first Marmot Trust based on the work by Professor Sir Michael Marmot, which predicts that disadvantage and subsequent poor health starts before birth and accumulates throughout life. A pilot of the Marmot Review principles and framework has started already in Luton and Newham.

Healthwatch Luton help remove the taboo of menopause

Back in August 2021, Healthwatch Luton joined the Menopause Working Group to look at people's experiences of the condition in the town. Healthwatch Luton created a survey to capture a range of responses covering treatment received for menopause and the care of individuals who had been or were going through the menopause, along with the support they felt they required. Look at the results and how they can provide a baseline for further action.





Shedding light on vaccine reluctance, and Covid 19 booster experiences

Healthwatch Luton has published the results of two surveys focusing on vaccinations. The first looks at why people choose not to get vaccinated and the reasons behind those decisions.

A further survey focused on people sharing their experiences of booking their Covid 19 booster vaccination and receiving it at a variety of venues across Luton.
