Support for people with disabilities in Dunstable



The development of a purpose-built facility in Dunstable will help transform the lives of people with a disability, thanks to a pioneering joint initiative between Central Bedfordshire Council, HBV Group and the NHS.

The new development at Quarry Walk provides accommodation for adults with disabilities and gives access to new technology to help people become more independent. The centre also boasts communal areas and private gardens that are designed to help residents engage with others and reduce social isolation. Read more.

Health and Care Strategy Launched

Our absolute focus as an Integrated Care System is helping people to live longer, happier lives in good health. Last year, we worked with partners to understand what care local people need, and, more importantly, what they want from their health and care services.

This work has been used to inform the Bedfordshire, Luton and Milton Keynes Integrated Care Partnership's strategy, which was approved by members of the Health and Care Partnership on 14 December 2022.

The strategy outlines what is important to local people and how we plan to deliver health and care services in the next years to meet that need.

Luton 2040 - a place to thrive

Tackling Dementia in Bedfordshire

Tackling dementia and supporting people to live as independently as possible is an area of focus for the Integrated Care System. We were delighted this month to roll out two initiatives across Bedfordshire to support dementia diagnosis and training for staff in care homes.

In Luton, the Bedfordshire Dementia Intensive Support Service has been awarded temporary NHS England funding until 31 March 2023 to support <u>care homes in Luton</u> who are caring for people with dementia. In Central Bedfordshire, a new specialist <u>diagnosis service</u> is being set up by East London Foundation Trust (ELFT) to support specialist nurses and healthcare professionals in diagnosing care home residents early.

We'll keep you updated with how these initiatives progress.

Council funds £5m for new radiotherapy unit



Bringing care closer to home for those receiving cancer treatment is important, as we know it leads to better outcomes for those living with cancer and their families.

Maple Centre Same Day Emergency Care Centre opened



As part of its ongoing commitment to improving patient experience, Milton Keynes University Hospital has opened the Maple Centre, a new facility designed to deliver an integrated approach to Same Day Emergency Care. Located adjacent to the Emergency Department, the centre will receive referrals from there as well as the Ambulance service, NHS111 and local GPs. Read more.

According to Bedford Borough Council's Annual Population Survey, fewer than one in 10 adults are now smoking in the Bedford Borough, a marked reduction on 2020 and 2018 figures.

Healthy workplace, healthy people

Studies show that for every pound spent on creating healthy workplaces, employers can improve productivity, reduce sickness and improve the health and wellbeing of their workforce.

Bedford Borough Council, Central Bedfordshire Council and Milton Keynes City Council are working together to launch a set of health and wellbeing standards for local workplaces.

More than 30 workplaces in the region have already signed up to the Healthy Workplace Standards including Carers in Bedfordshire. Read more.

Diabetes is one of the biggest challenges we face in Bedfordshire, Luton and Milton Keynes – contributing to hospital admissions and poor outcomes for local people.

Milton Keynes City Council and Milton Keynes University Hospital has announced a research trial to promote and incentivise physical activity amongst residents with Type 2 diabetes which affects more than 17,000 people across Milton Keynes.

The scheme, funded by the NHS, will test how wearable devices can record participant movement and how a mobile app could offer tailored prompts and hints. Read more.

Robot Helps to Deliver Medicine in Hospital

The first-of-its-kind trial has begun in Milton Keynes University Hospital who are working with an artificial intelligence company to create and trial a delivery robot or 'Helper Bot' to help deliver non-controlled medication between the pharmacy and selected in-patient wards.

This trial builds on successfully introduced automations including a surgical robot to aid complex surgeries and AI across imaging services. Read more.


CNWL Year of the Child 2022-2023
